Requirements on States:

Art. 6: Compensation – Each State Party shall ensure that its domestic legal system contains measures that offer victims of trafficking in persons the possibility of obtaining compensation for damage suffered.



18 U.S.C. § 1591: Sex Trafficking of Children or by Force, Fraud, or Coercion





Adults: The use of force, fraud, or coercion to "cause the person to engage in a commercial sex act."



Children: If the victim is under 18, federal law does not require "force, fraud, or coercion."



Future Losses




Mandatory Restitution: Out of Pocket

- "any other losses suffered . . . as a proximate result of the offense."

Woodbury woman admits to abusing, forcing Chinese nanny into labor

A Woodbury woman arrested last year after her Chinese nanny was found beaten and malnourished agreed Wednesday to plead guilty to both federal and state charges that include elements of forced labor and assault.

Lili Huang's plea canceled a federal trial scheduled for next week in Minneapolis. As part of the agreement, federal prosecutors said that they agreed to request a one-year sentence to be followed by deportation to China.

Huang, 36, admitted to withholding a passport "in furtherance of [the] forced labor" of a nanny she brought from Shanghai to work for her last year. Speaking through an interpreter, Huang told U.S. Senior District Judge David Doty that she had confiscated the 58-

U.S. v. Kizzy Kalu

- Trafficked nurses into the U.S. using a fake "university" to obtain H-1B visas;
- Demanded that nurses pay \$800 - \$1200 per month or face deportation;
- Threatened nurses with a \$25,000 fine for absconding;
- Sentenced to 10 years and 8 months in prison;
- Ordered to pay \$3.7 million in restitution.



HOUSTON – The 68-year-old woman behind a 14-defendant sex trafficking ring operating in Houston has been ordered to federal prison for life, announced U.S. Attorney Kenneth Magidson along with FBI Special Agent in Charge Perrye K. Turner, Special Agent in Charge Brian Moskowitz of Immigration and Customs Enforcement – Homeland Security Investigations (ICE-HSI), and Special Agent in Charge Richard Goss of IRS-Criminal Investigation (CI).



Between 2003 and 2021, plaintiffs filed 493 lawsuits under the civil provision of the Trafficking Victims Protection Act.





