Families, neighbors and communities are empowered to protect and ensure the safety of one another with the support of NGOs, influencers, local authorities, religious leaders and government.



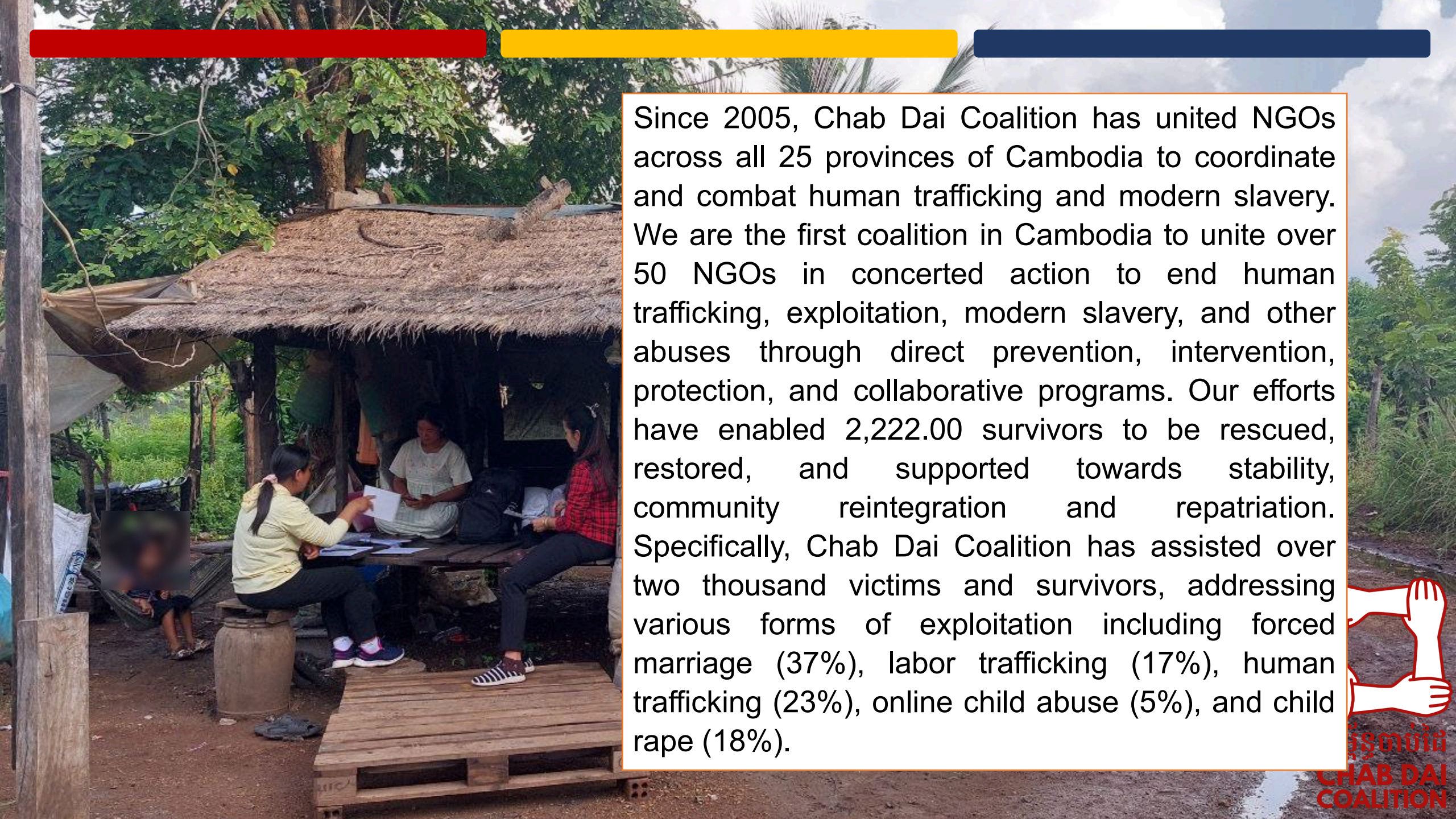
Government entities on both the national and local levels have the knowledge, resources, policy frameworks, and political will to respond effectively and efficiently to cases of modern slavery and sexual abuse.



Survivors have the rights to access services, grounded in their self-identified restoration needs. Survivors are empowered to raise their voices and experiences to influence their restoration journey.



Since 2005, Chab Dai Coalition has united NGOs across all 25 provinces of Cambodia to coordinate and combat human trafficking and modern slavery. We are the first coalition in Cambodia to unite over 50 NGOs in concerted action to end human trafficking, exploitation, modern slavery, and other abuses through direct prevention, intervention, protection, and collaborative programs. Our efforts have enabled 2,222.00 survivors to be rescued, restored, and supported towards stability, community reintegration and repatriation. Specifically, Chab Dai Coalition has assisted over two thousand victims and survivors, addressing various forms of exploitation including forced marriage (37%), labor trafficking (17%), human trafficking (23%), online child abuse (5%), and child rape (18%).

The capacity building for local partners and relevant stakeholders is very crucial. This approach will empower communities to take ownership of their roles in supporting survivors, increase service accessibility, and expand the range of services available to meet survivors' needs.



### Recommendations:

- 1. Implement Capacity Building Initiatives:** Develop targeted training programs for local government and community partners to enhance their skills in child protection, safe migration, counseling, and other relevant areas.
- 2. Promote Community Ownership:** Encourage local stakeholders to take ownership of programs by involving them in decision-making processes and program implementation.
- 3. Expand Service Offerings:** Support local partners in expanding their service offerings, enabling them to provide a broader range of services beyond awareness raising, including counseling and support for survivors.
- 4. Establish Community Support Teams:** Create and empower community support teams composed of diverse members (DCWC/CCWC, teachers, village leaders) to assist in client management and service delivery.
- 5. Evaluate and Adapt:** Regularly assess the effectiveness of capacity-building initiatives and community support teams to ensure they meet the evolving needs of survivors and the community.
